The electors of the City of North Lauderdale, Broward County, Florida, are hereby notified that **between the hours of 7:00 o'clock am and 7:00 o'clock pm on Tuesday, November 3, 2020** there will be a **General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing TWO CITY COMMISSIONERS, ONE IN DISTRICT "C" AND ONE IN DISTRICT "D" TO FOUR YEAR TERMS.** This coincides with a Countywide Election and all polling locations will be open.

Candidates for the office of Commissioner shall file a written notice of candidacy which shall designate that the candidate is a US citizen; is a qualified elector of the City; has been a resident within their designated election district for at least one (1) year immediately and continuously prior to qualifying for office and must be at least 18 years of age.

Any registered elector of the City of North Lauderdale, Broward County, Florida, desiring to seek office may do so by filing the proper qualifying papers with and before the City Clerk of the City of North Lauderdale. **QUALIFYING WILL BEGIN ON MONDAY, JUNE 8, 2020 AT 12:00 NOON AND WILL END AT 12:00 NOON ON FRIDAY, JUNE 12, 2020.**

Any resident of the City of North Lauderdale, Broward County, Florida, desiring to become a registered voter may do so by registering with the Broward County Supervisor of Elections. The books will be closed against further registration on October 5, 2020.

Absentee ballots for the City of North Lauderdale, Broward County, Florida, General Election, may be obtained from the Broward County Supervisor of Elections Office, 115 S. Andrews Avenue, Room 111, Fort Lauderdale, Florida 33301. All absentee ballots must be received in the Supervisor of Elections office no later than 7:00 o'clock pm on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. Voted Absentee Ballots may not be turned in at the polling places on Election Day.

The aforesaid election, qualifying of candidates, voter's registration and absentee ballots shall be conducted and handled in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida.
